








QUICK GUIDE TO COMMON PLAGIARISM TYPES

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Type	Type of Plagiarism
<p>The Clone</p> 	<p>A Learner submitting word-for-word academic work of another as his / her own.</p>
<p>The Cut and Paste</p> 	<p>An academic work contains significant number of UNACKNOWLEDGED quotations in it.</p>
<p>The Hijack</p> 	<p>An academic work consists of hijacked ideas of some others. The key words and phrases “translated” but essentially similar or exact to the content of an unacknowledged source</p>
<p>Inaccurate Referencing</p> 	<p>An academic work is referenced (inaccurately) without</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. following rules of appropriate referencing style (Harvard OSCOLA) 2. indicating relevant secondary referencing and 3. any match between in-text and end-text references
<p>The Patchwork</p> 	<p>An academic work accurately referenced however without</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. connective narrative 2. appropriateness, 3. relevancy 4. logical flow and 5. personal voice appropriate to the level
